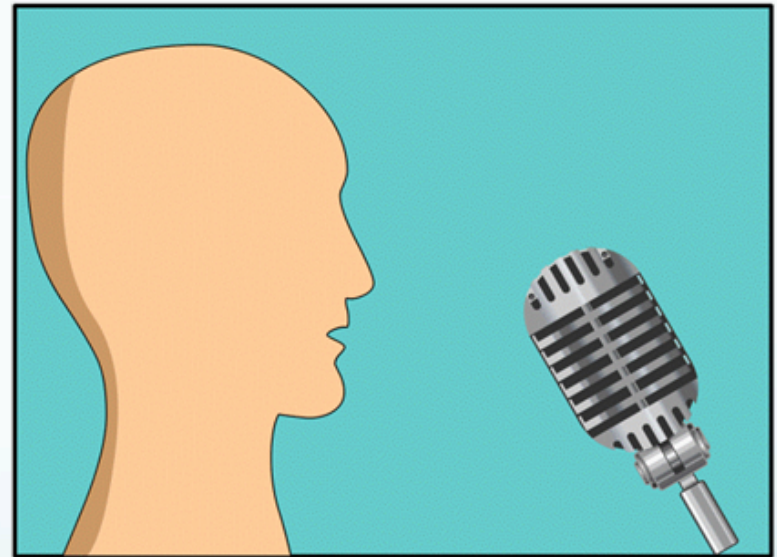
The power is in the SPOKEN word!

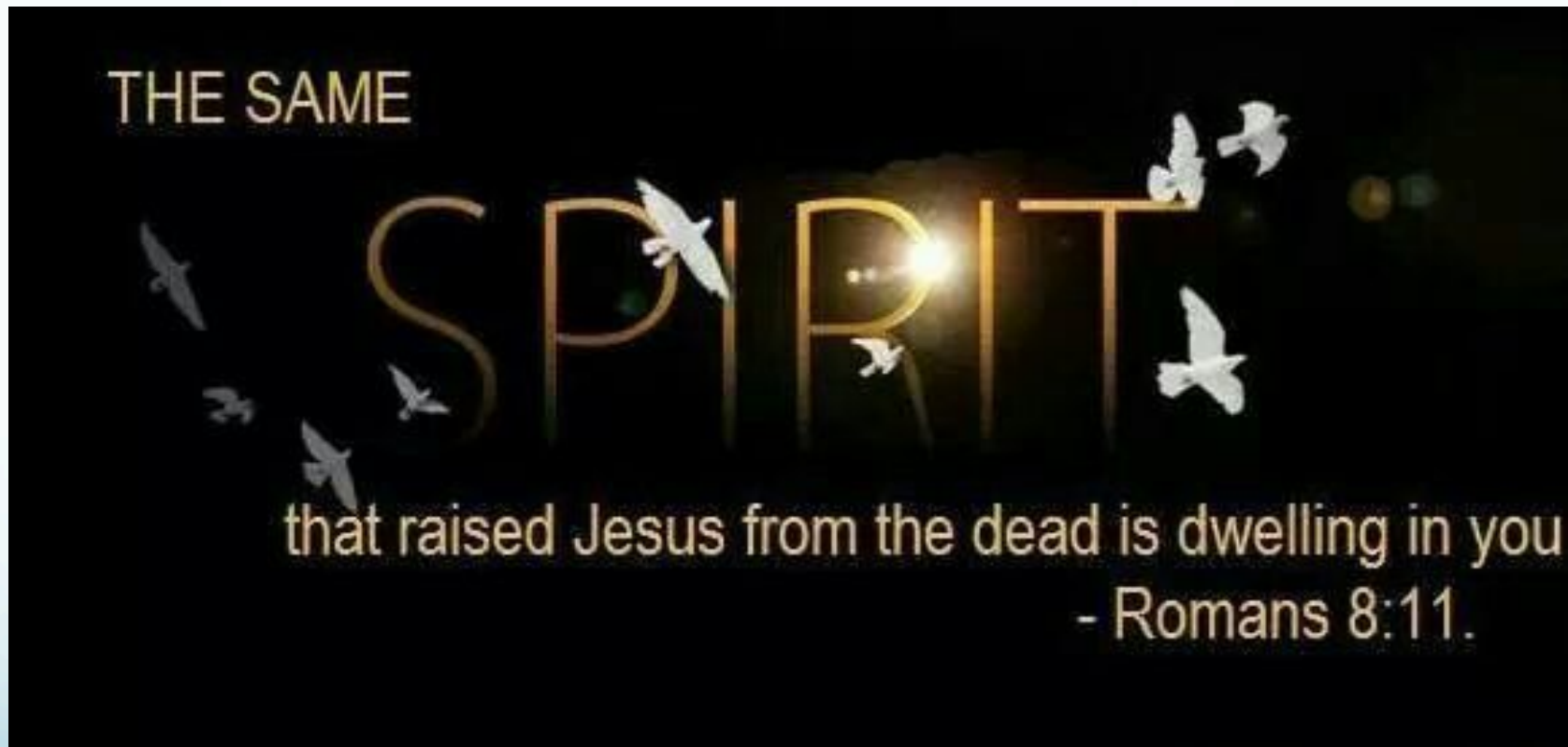
Jesus' Resurrection

What does Jesus say about words?

- Matthew 12:34-35
- 34 You brood of snakes! How could evil men like you speak what is good and right? For whatever is in your heart determines what you say.
- 35 A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart, and an evil person produces evil things from the treasury of an evil heart.
- Matthew 15:17-18
- 17 “Anything you eat passes through the stomach and then goes into the sewer.18 But the words you speak come from the heart—that’s what defiles you.
- Matthew 15:11 11 It’s not what goes into your mouth that defiles you; you are defiled by the words that come out of your mouth.”

What did Jesus say about words?

- Mark 7:20-23
- 20 And then he added, “It is what comes from inside that defiles you. 21 For from within, out of a person’s heart, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, 22 adultery, greed, wickedness, deceit, lustful desires, envy, slander, pride, and foolishness. 23 All these vile things come from within; they are what defile you.”
- Luke 6:45
- A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart, and an evil person produces evil things from the treasury of an evil heart. What you say flows from what is in your heart.

The Heart

- James 1:14-15
- 14 Temptation comes from our own **desires**, which entice us and drag us away.
- 15 These desires give birth to sinful actions. And when sin is allowed to grow, it gives birth to death.

Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life.

“The human heart is the most deceitful of all things, and desperately wicked. Who really knows how bad it is?”

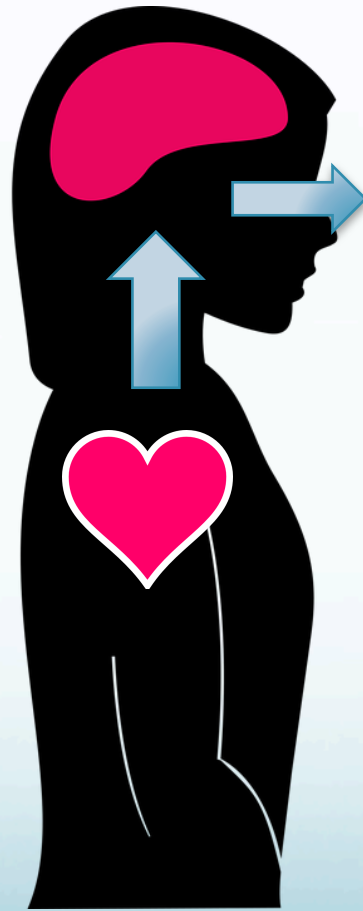


The MEDIATATION of the Heart

- May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing to you, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer.

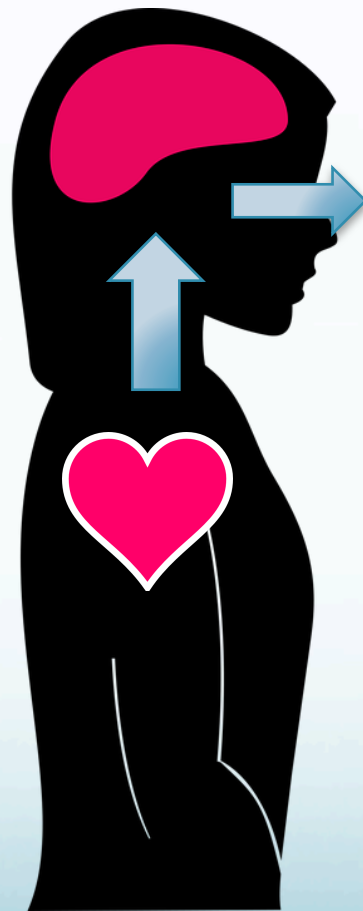

FIFTH AMENDMENT

- The 5th Amendment protects people from being held for committing a crime unless they are properly indicted, (accused)
 - You may not be tried twice for the same crime (double jeopardy)
 - You don't have to testify against yourself in court. (Self-incrimination)

Miranda Warning



- Didn't know he had a right to a lawyer first.
- Didn't know that he didn't have to answer questions while being interrogated.
- Argued he had not been informed of his constitutional rights to remain silent or have a lawyer present.

We have the RIGHT/ BENEFIT to remain silent!



- Devil = accuser of the brethren
- Us = we have the right or benefit to NOT answer him or the problem
- Jesus will do the talking

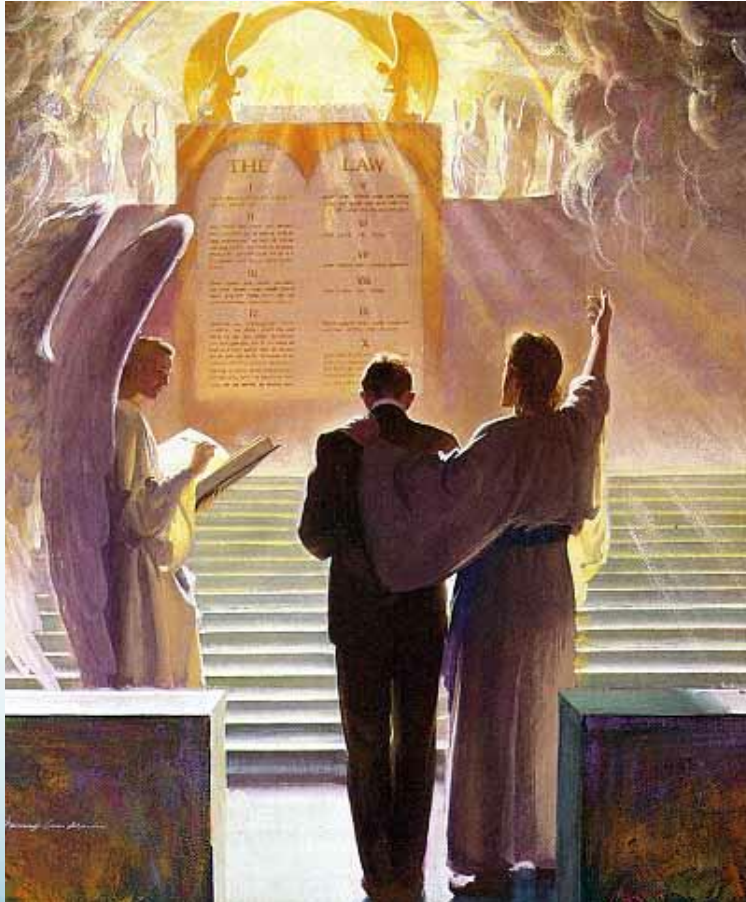

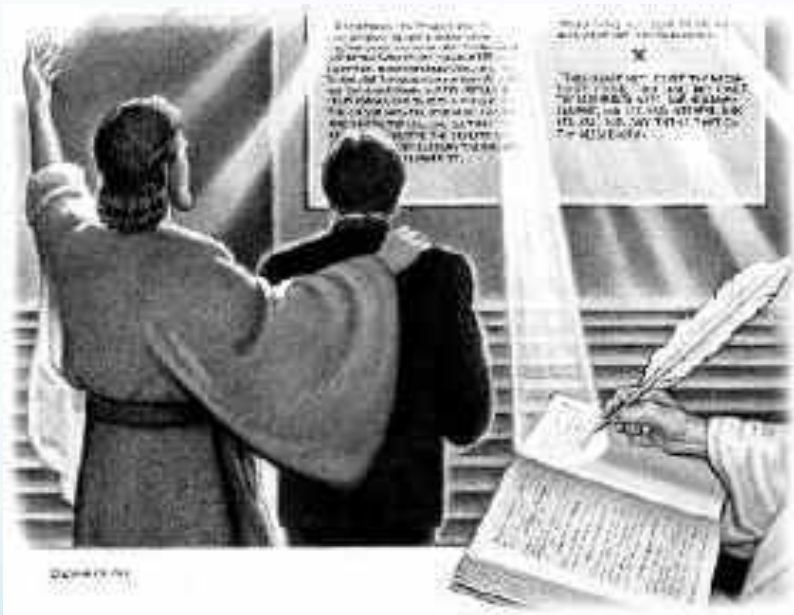
- Don't waste your breath on problems!

Christ is the end of the law!



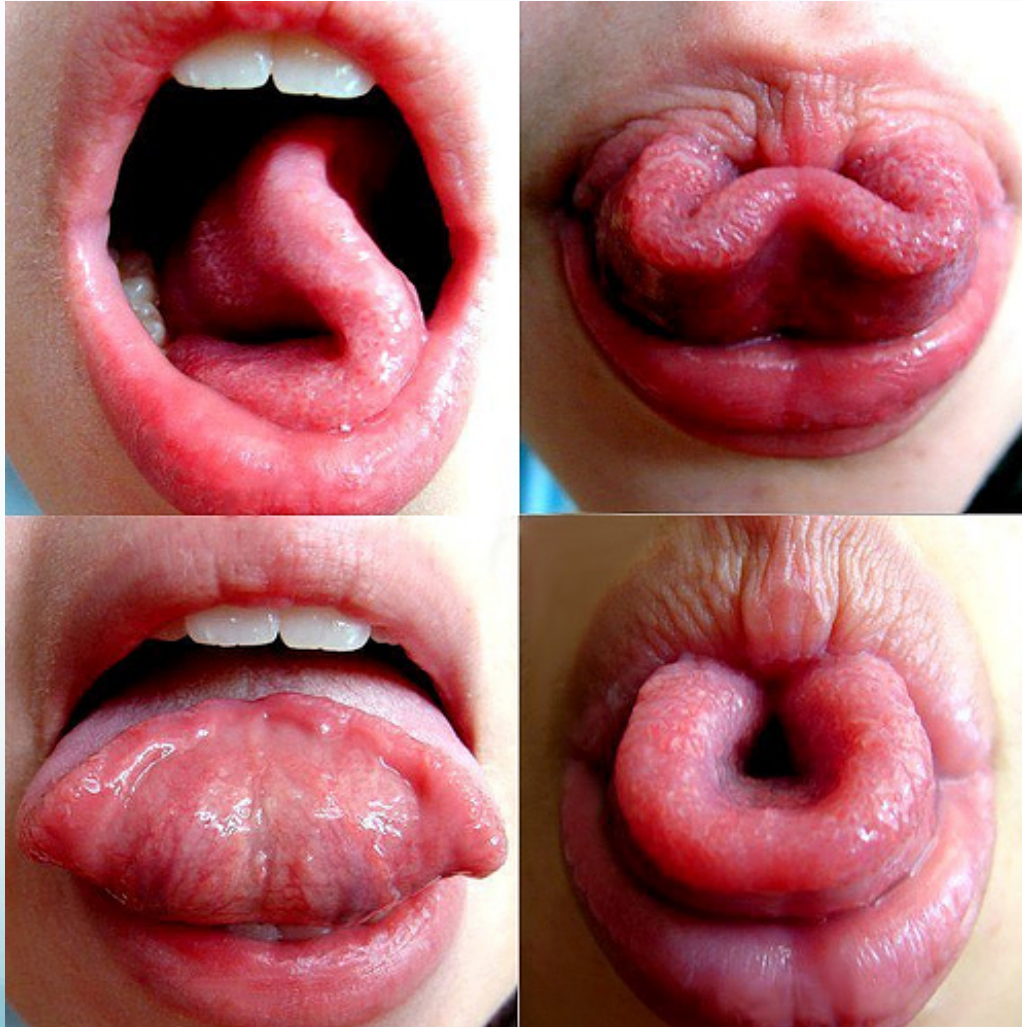
- Romans 5:12-13
Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned: 13 (For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law.

Word Factory

- Apply to speaking to your mountain: Train our hearts like James tells us to train our tongues.



We need to TRAIN our tongue
to speak life!



James 3:1-8 (NLT)

- *5 Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasteth great things. Behold, how great a matter a little fire kindleth!*
- *6 And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity: so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire of hell.*



The bit allows us to control a horse many times our size.



Heart → Words

- What's in our hearts will always influence the way we act. If our hearts are focused on pure and godly things, our words and actions will reflect that. But if our hearts are selfish, the words we speak will make that clear as well.

Difference between Talking and Speaking
