John 1:4 In him was life; and the life was the light of men.


Garden Of Eden

Genesis 2:8 ¶And the LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed.










Garden Of Flatland(Eden)




ATHEISM



Kurt Goedel



Kurt Friedrich Gödel (/ kart 'ga:del/;^[2] German: ['kʊɐ̯t 'gøːdl] (📣 listen); April 28, 1906 – January 14, 1978) was an Austrian, and later American, logician, mathematician, and philosopher. Considered with Aristotle and Gottlob Frege to be one of the most significant logicians in history Gödel made an immense impact upon scientific and philosophical thinking in the 20th century, a time when others such as Bertrand Russell,^[3] A. N. Whitehead,^[3] and David Hilbert were pioneering the use of logic and set theory to understand the foundations of mathematics.

Trinitarianism



John 10:30 I and my Father are one. John 14:17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you.

- Within the ranks of the Trinity teaching, there are two different beliefs. Some emphasize the Trinity by expressing the unity of God without having developed the understanding of what is meant by the term "Trinity" –three distinct persons in the Godhead.
- Others emphasize the "three-ness" of the Trinity to the point that they believe in three separate beings: coequal, co-eternal, totally distinct persons which are separate from one another. Thus, honest Trinitarians will tell you they believe in three gods but that these three are one God, emphasizing the oneness only in unity. This view is essentially Tritheistic.

BINITARIANISM



Hosea 13:4 Yet I am the LORD thy God from the land of Egypt, and thou shalt know no god but me: for there is no savior beside me.

- •BINITARIANISM This belief does not classify the Holy Ghost as a separate person, but asserts belief in two persons in the Godhead. •Revelation 4: 2 And immediately I was in the spirit: and, behold, a throne was set in heaven, and one sat on the throne.

Monotheism: The Oneness View



Sabellius (fl. ca. 215) was a thirdcentury priest and theologian who most likely taught in Rome, but may have been a North African from Libya. Basil and others call him a Libyan from Pentapolis, but this seems to rest on the fact that Pentapolis was a place where the teachings of Sabellius thrived, according to Dionysius of Alexandria, c. 260.[1]

- The second class of monotheists believes
- emphatically that there is only one true
- God, but further believes that the fullness
- of the one true God was manifested
- (revealed or exhibited) in Jesus Christ.
- They believe the Father, Son and Holy
- Ghost are manifestations, modes, offices or
- relationships that the one true God has
- displayed to man.

Sabellius taught that God was single and indivisible, with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit being three modes or manifestations of one divine Person. A Sabellian modalist would say that the One God successively revealed Himself to man throughout time as the Father in Creation; the Son in Redemption; and the Spirit in Sanctification and Regeneration.
